VICTIMS COMPENSATION

If you choose to report to the police, you may be eligible for Victims Compensation through Victims Services (< <https://www.saskatchewan.ca/residents/justice-crime-and-the-law/victims-of-crime-and-abuse/compensation-for-victims-of-crime>>).

You may receive compensation for loss of income, counselling, ambulance costs, medical or dental bills, or damage to or loss of clothing.

In the case of sexual assault, you are eligible to apply within two years from the date the offence was reported to the police.
