Watch for Ticks!

Blacklegged (deer) ticks can carry Lyme and other diseases.





American dog tick

- Most common in Saskatchewan
- Does **NOT** transmit Lyme disease



Blacklegged tick

- Occasionally found in Saskatchewan
- Can carry Lyme and other diseases

Protect yourself

- Wear pants, a long-sleeved shirt and close-toed shoes or boots.
- Use insect repellent containing DEET or Icaridin.
- Check yourself, your children and pets after being outdoors.
- Remove any attached ticks promptly with tweezers.
- Submit a picture to eTick.ca for quick identification.



- Please keep ticks in a secure container. If they are among the targeted species, researchers may ask you to submit the ticks by mail.
- See your healthcare provider if you suspect you have a tick-borne disease such as Lyme.
