Re: Reports of Myocarditis/Pericarditis Post-COVID-19 Immunization

Dear Colleagues:

On June 3, 2021, the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) released a communique to health practitioners regarding reports of myocarditis and pericarditis after COVID-19 vaccination which is attached to this letter.

PHAC and Health Canada are monitoring international reports of myocarditis and pericarditis following vaccination with COVID-19 mRNA vaccines in young adults and adolescents. In most cases, patients who presented for medical care have responded well to medications and rest and had prompt improvement of symptoms. Reported cases have occurred predominantly in male adolescents and young adults 16 years of age and older. Onset was typically within several days after mRNA COVID-19 vaccination, and cases have occurred more often after the second dose than the first dose.
