



# Ministerial Licensure

## 4.2 LICENSURE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICERS

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To qualify for a ministerial licence, a physician must:

1. Demonstrate that the physician meets the requirements that apply to all applicants for licensure:
  - English Language Proficiency\*; and,
  - Credential Verification\*; and,
  - Examinations; and,
  - Currency of Practice; and,
  - Good Character; and,
  - Good Standing.

2. Practise as a designated public health officer for the Saskatchewan Health Authority; **and**,
3. Produce evidence in a form and manner that may be prescribed by Council that the applicant:
  - a. is a graduate in medicine of a university approved by the Council; **and**,
  - b. meets registration requirements; **and**
  - c. provides all required documentation and fees.

Conditions relating to Ministerial Licensure for Public Health Officers:
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. The Ministerial licence only authorizes the physician to practise as a designated public health officer for a Regional Health Authority with respect to which the Minister's request was made.</li><li>b. A Ministerial licence shall be automatically revoked and cease to be valid if the holder of the licence ceases to work in the position with respect to which the Minister's request was made.</li></ol>



\* Required if you are a physician with a foreign medical degree.
