## 1.1 Physicians with Canadian Postgraduate Training

This section applies to physicians who have Canadian Postgraduate Training, but do not qualify for a regular licence on the basis that the physician currently holds a licence to practise medicine in Canada.

## To qualify for a regular licence, a physician who has Canadian Postgraduate Training must:

- a) Demonstrate that the physician meets the requirements that apply to all applicants for licensure:
  - English Language Proficiency\*, and
  - Credential Verification\*, and
  - Examinations, and
  - Currency Of Practice, and
  - Good Character, and
  - Good Standing.

(Please see the requirements page for details regarding the above points)

- b) Have obtained the designation Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada (LMCC); and,
- c) Attained certification with the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CCFP);
  or
- d) Attained certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

For physicians who currently hold a licence to practice in another Canadian jurisdiction, please see section entitled "Physicians with Licensure in another Canadian Jurisdiction"

\* Required if you are a physician with a foreign medical degree.
