

1.3 Physicians with International Postgraduate Training

This section applies to physicians who have Postgraduate Training that occurred in a country other than Canada and the United States and who do not qualify for a regular licence on the basis that the physician currently holds a licence to practise medicine in Canada.

There are two pathways to licensure. Regardless of the pathway, to qualify for a regular licence, a physician who has International Postgraduate Training must

Demonstrate that the physician meets the requirements that apply to all applicants for licensure:

- English Language Proficiency*, and
- Credential Verification*, and
- Examinations, and
- Currency Of Practice, and
- Good Character, and
- Good Standing.

1. Examination Route to Regular Licensure for physicians with International Postgraduate Training

The physician must have:

- a) Successfully completed a period of practice while under a provisional licence; and.
- b) Attained certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CCFP) or Certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC); and,
- c) Obtained the designation Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada or successfully completed medical licensing examinations in the United States of America acceptable to the Council.

2. Summative Assessment Route to Regular Licensure for physicians with International Postgraduate Training

The physician must have:

- a) Successfully completed a period of practice while under a provisional licence; and,
- b) Been successful in an assessment which demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Council that the applicant has appropriate skill, knowledge and suitability to practise independently.

^{*} Required if you are a physician with a foreign medical degree.
