

The Executive Committee of the College of Physicians and Surgeons directs that, pursuant to section 47.6 of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981**, the Discipline Committee hear the following charges against Dr. Charles Smith, namely:

You Dr. Charles Smith are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of Section 46(o) of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981** s.s. 1980-81 c. M-10.1.

The evidence that will be lead in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:

1. You applied for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan (Hereafter called "the College") and supplied information to The College as part of that application;
2. On or about July 22, 2005 you sent an email message to the College which, in relation to the standard questions asked of applicants, stated, "In answer to the questions in Section 17, the answer to subsection 11 ("have ever been sued for malpractice") is 'yes'. Because of my extensive work in the medico-legal environment, I have been sued along with police officer and others.
3. That statement was misleading.
4. On or about the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of August, 2005, you received an email message from the College which stated:  
*"I assume from the comments in your message to us, that the answer to our standard questions respecting licensure are all "no" other than for question 17, which is "yes " as you explained in your message. ...*  
*For greater certainty, I will repeat the questions below..."*
5. On or about the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of August, 2005 you sent an email message to the College in which you stated, "The answer to the questions in your message, number 19 notwithstanding, is 'No'. I had checked the 'no' boxes on the CPSS web form, but perhaps they did not get transmitted to you as I had intended"
6. That statement was false or misleading.
7. On or about the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2005, you attended at the office of the College and there completed an application form. The application form contained the question "Have you ever been the subject of an enquiry or investigation by a medical licensing authority or hospital?" To that question, you answered "No".

8. That answer was false or misleading.
9. On or about the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2005, you attended at the office of the College and there completed an application form. The application form contained the question "Have you ever been suspended, disqualified, censured, or had any disciplinary action taken against you as a member of any profession?" To that question, you answered "No".
10. That answer was false or misleading.
