NOTE: Allegations of unprofessional conduct as set out in the charge below have been referred to the discipline committee. The allegations in the charge have not been admitted, nor has there been a hearing before the discipline committee to determine whether the allegations in the charge will be proved.

A physician who denies some or all of the allegations in a charge is entitled to a hearing before the discipline committee to determine if the allegations in the charge are established by the evidence at the hearing.

The Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons directs that, pursuant to section 47.5 of **The Medical Profession Act, 1981**, the Discipline Committee hear the following charges against Dr. Cameron Curtis, namely:

CHARGE 1

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or bylaw 7.1; and/or bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(ix) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by accepting concurrent shifts in both the general ward and the obstetrics ward of a Regina Hospital and/or excessive billing.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to December 2024 you accepted concurrent shifts on both the general ward and the obstetrics ward of a Regina Hospital.
- 2) By accepting concurrent shifts on both the general ward and the obstetrics ward of a Regina Hospital you breached your agreement with the Saskatchewan Health Authority.

- 3) By accepting concurrent shifts on both the general ward and the obstetrics ward of a Regina Hospital you breached the expectation that you would be on the ward and available to respond if a patient's condition deteriorated or there was a medical emergency.
- 4) By accepting concurrent shifts on both the general ward and the obstetrics ward of a Regina Hospital you placed patient safety at risk.
- 5) You submitted billings for your concurrent shifts on both the general ward and the obstetrics ward.

CHARGE 2

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 52B and/or Code 53B.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 52B and/or Code 53B as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.
- 3) You failed to maintain appropriate records in relation to situations in which you billed Payment Code 52B and/or Code 53B.
- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for Payment Code 52B and/or Code 53B.
- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed Payment Code 52B and/or Code 53B were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 3

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 9B.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 9B as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.

- 3) You failed to maintain appropriate records in relation to situations in which you billed Payment Code 9B.
- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for Payment Code 9B.
- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed Payment Code 9B were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 4

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 3B.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 3B as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.
- 3) You failed to maintain appropriate records in relation to situations in which you billed Payment Code 3B.
- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for Payment Code 3B.
- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed Payment Code 3B were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 5

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for one or more of Payment Codes 64B to 68B.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for one or more of Payment Codes 64B to 68B as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.
- 3) You failed to maintain appropriate records in relation to situations in which you billed for one or more of Payment Codes 64B to 68B.

- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for one or more of Payment Codes 64B to 68B.
- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed one or more of Payment Codes 64B to 68B were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 6

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 42B.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 42B as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.
- 3) You failed to maintain appropriate records in relation to situations in which you billed Payment Code 42B.
- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for Payment Code 42B.
- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed Payment Code 42B were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 7

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for one or more of Payment Codes 815A to 839A.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for one or more of Payment Codes 815A to 839A as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.
- 3) You failed to maintain appropriate records in relation to situations in which you billed for one or more of Payment Codes 815A to 839A.
- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for one or more of Payment Codes 64B to 68B.

- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed one or more of Payment Codes 815A to 839A were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 8

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(i), 46(j), 46(k), 46(l), 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or paragraph 44 of the Code of Ethics contained in bylaw 7.1 of the bylaws as they existed until December 2019; and/or paragraph (bb) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour" in bylaw 7.2; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(iii) of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by excessive billing and/or by failing to maintain appropriate records of your patient interactions.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) During the period from approximately November 2019 to June 2021 you caused or permitted excessive billing to Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 5B.
- 2) You did not provide the services necessary to meet the requirements to bill Medical Services Branch for Payment Code 5B as set out in the Physician Payment Schedule.
- 3) You billed for Payment Code 5B in situations in which you did not have an in-person interaction with the patient.
- 4) You deliberately billed improperly for Payment Code 5B.
- 5) In the alternative, you failed to exercise due diligence to ensure that your billings for the services for which you billed Payment Code 5B were consistent with the requirements to bill those payment codes.

CHARGE 9

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*; and/or bylaw 8.1(b)(ix) and/or bylaw 23.1 of the Regulatory Bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, particulars whereof are that you failed to maintain appropriate medical records for your patients.

CHARGE 10

You Dr. Cameron Curtis are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of sections 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981* and/or bylaw 7.1 and/or bylaw 7.2 of the bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, by providing inaccurate, misleading or untruthful information to the Joint Medical Professional Review Committee.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include some or all of the following:

- 1) On or about September 14, 2023 you were interviewed by the Joint Medical Professional Review Committee.
- 2) During that interview you made inaccurate, misleading or untruthful statements related to your involvement in billings submitted to the Medical Services Branch.

- 3) During that interview you made one or more statements that suggested you had little oversight over the billings submitted to the Medical Services Branch.
- 4) During that interview you made one or more statements that suggested you had limited involvement in determining what fee code would be billed in submissions to the Medical Services Branch.
