TO: Dr. Jeremy Reed, medical practitioner:

Notice of Hearing

TAKE NOTICE that a hearing will be held before the Discipline Hearing Committee of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan beginning on **May 9, 2025** at the hour of 9:00 a.m. at the Offices of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan located at Second Floor - 2174 Airport Drive, Saskatoon Saskatchewan.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that at this hearing the Discipline Hearing Committee will hear the charges set out below.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that you may be represented by counsel at the above hearing.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that should you fail to appear for the above hearing, such order as may be deemed appropriate may be made in your absence.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the hearing will be conducted into the following charges laid by the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons, namely:

Charge 1

You Dr Jeremy Reed are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of section 46(o) and/or section 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981 s.s. 1980- 81 c. M-10.1* and/or bylaw 7.1 and/or bylaw 7.2 and/or bylaw 8.1.

The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:

1. On or about August 2, 2022 you performed surgery on Patient Number 1.

2. Prior to performing surgery on Patient Number 1 you requested \$4,800 in payment.
3. You received payment in the amount of \$4,800 in relation to performing the surgery.
4. The amount of \$4,800 was excessive in relation to the services performed.
5. The payment was not consistent with the services provided.
6. The payment was not consistent with any applicable payment schedule for insured or uninsured services.
7. You advised Patient Number 1's family that the money paid would cover the labour costs for your "team" or used words to similar effect.
8. You paid the anesthetist involved in the surgery approximately \$500 or \$600.
9. Your statement that the money paid would cover the labour costs for your "team" or similar words was untruthful, inaccurate or misleading.
10. Your conduct with Patient Number 1 and/or the patient's family failed to meet the expectation in regulatory bylaw 7.1 that you would act with honesty.
11. Your conduct with Patient Number 1 and/or the patient's family failed to meet the expectation in regulatory bylaw 7.1 that you would act with integrity.
12. Your conduct with Patient Number 1 and/or the patient's family failed to meet the expectation in regulatory bylaw 7.1 that you should never exploit a patient for personal advantage.
13. Your conduct with Patient Number 1 and/or the patient's family failed to meet the expectation in regulatory bylaw 7.2 that you would maintain high standards of personal and professional honesty and integrity.
14. Your conduct with Patient Number 1 and/or the patient's family failed to meet the expectation in regulatory bylaw 7.2 that you would interact with patients and families, visitors, employees, physicians, volunteers, healthcare providers and others with courtesy, honesty, respect, and dignity.

Charge 2

You Dr Jeremy Reed are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of section 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act*, 1981 s.s. 1980- 81 c. M-10.1 and/or bylaw 7.1 paragraph 11 and/or bylaw 7.2 paragraph (y) under the heading Responsible Behaviour. The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:

1. On or about March 9, 2022 you authorized or permitted Physician Number 1 to perform a surgical procedure on a patient referred to in this charge as "Patient Number 1".
2. Physician Number 1 had privileges with the Saskatchewan Health Region to provide surgical assisting, but did not have the privileges to perform the procedure which was performed on Patient Number 1.
3. Physician Number 1 does not hold qualifications in orthopedic surgery that are recognized for the purpose of licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan.

4. You did not advise Patient Number 1 that Physician Number 1 would be performing the surgical procedure.
5. You did not seek Patient Number 1's consent to have Physician Number 1 perform all, or a major portion of the surgery.
6. You did not obtain Patient Number 1's consent to have Physician Number 1 perform all, or a major portion of the surgery.
7. You failed to obtain informed consent from Patient Number 1 for the procedure.

Charge 3

You Dr Jeremy Reed are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of section 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act*, 1981 s.s. 1980- 81 c. M-10.1 and/or the provisions of bylaw 7.1 under the heading "Commitment to the well-being of the patient" and/or bylaw 7.2 paragraph (a) under the heading "Responsible Behaviour". The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:


1. On or about March 9, 2022 you authorized or permitted Physician Number 1 to perform a surgical procedure on a patient referred to in this charge as "Patient Number 1".
2. Physician Number 1 had privileges with the Saskatchewan Health Region to provide surgical assisting, but did not have the privileges to perform the procedure which was performed on Patient Number 1.

Charge 4

You Dr Jeremy Reed are guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct contrary to the provisions of section 46(o) and/or 46(p) of *The Medical Profession Act*, 1981 s.s. 1980- 81 c. M-10.1 and/or bylaw 7.2. The evidence that will be led in support of this charge will include one or more of the following:

1. On or about March 9, 2022 you authorized or permitted Physician Number 1 to perform a surgical procedure on a patient referred to in this charge as "Patient Number 1".
2. You billed Medical Services Branch for performing the surgery on Patient Number 1.
3. You did not meet the requirements in the Physician Payment Schedule to bill Medical Services Plan for the surgery.
4. You failed to take reasonable care to ensure that your claim for payment for professional services were appropriate, were consistent with the services provided, and were consistent with any applicable payment schedule for insured services.
